


FINANCES

Total number of institutions involved in Charity Week 2010, including universities, schools, colleges and others organisations.




Regional Charity Week Totals 2010



PROJECTS FUNDED



Where the Money Goes ...

So where did all the money you raised get spent? Alhumdulillah, after consultation and discussion the following projects were chosen. In the future, inshaAllah we hope to make the process more interactive and get a wider variety of projects. Updates on all of these projects will be made available on the website as they come in.

Refurbishment of 13 Schools in Pakistan £268,687

Following the floods of 2010, many schools were destroyed. Charity Week will fund the reconstruction and refurbishment of 13 (yes THIRTEEN!) schools in the Muzaffarbagh area. This includes providing running water and wash facilities for each school, building a playground for each and buying school bags, stationery and desks for 4561 students. We may not be able to change their past, but by providing them with a chance of a good education, they may have a better future inshaAllah.

Medical Care & Surgery for Orphans in Pakistan £55,223

Orphan and needy children in Rawalpindi struggle to get access to any health care. Our funding will help them get medical attention via a mobile clinic, pay for their prescriptions, provide health screening and pay for any surgery required for hundreds of orphans & disabled children.

Buying material to Construct Orphan Homes in Chechnya £27,118

Many children were orphaned during the wars in Chechnya. To add to their misery, their houses were so destroyed that they were made homeless or (if lucky) lived in rehabilitation centres. The money we raised will go towards building up to 50 homes for orphans and will mean that at least 150 orphans & disabled children will be able to live in a place to call their own.

Top up for our Occational Training Project in Indonesia £911


Charity Week 2010 invested over £5000 in providing Vocational Training in many disciplines to Indonesian Orphans from Banda Aceh. The Vocational Training programmes for mobile phones servicing has been upgraded to Graphic Design training as it is felt that this will provide more realistic job opportunities. The £911 will pay for the upgrade of the training and resources to assist in this.

2 Year Renewal of the 76 orphans in Pakistan £47,856 (+ £210 per month in standing orders)

We originally sponsored 100 orphans of the South East Asia Earthquake in 2005. 24 are now able to support themselves, thanks to your efforts. Read a case report of one of the remaining 76 that we continue to fund on the next page.

IR Orphans General Fund £64.88

Any money left-over has been allocated to the general Orphans fund.

Case Study:

Muhammad Nazir

Muhammad Nazir was only 4 years old when his father and mother passed away in the South East Asia Earthquake of 2005.

He was taken in by his elderly grandparents who could barely look after themselves.

Thanks to your support for the last 6 years, he has been able to continue getting an education and is pursuing his dream to become a teacher. The sponsorship also helps his grandparents provide him with food and avoid diseases due to poor hygiene.

His grandfather says, Muhammad "prays 5 times a day and never forgets the donors and their families in his prayers. They have made his life easier to bear."
